




#### Rakta Kali temple, Matsyagandha, Saharsa,

The barren water logged area in Saharsa town has been developed as a beautiful place commonly known as Matsyagandha Mandir. The construction of Rakta Kali temple and an oval shaped temple with 64 deities (known as 64- Yogini) engraved on the inner walls of temple, attracts devotees from far-off places. The Bihar Government has established a beautiful tourist complex at this place.

There is no well-known "Vishnu Temple" specifically in Saharsa, Bihar; the primary ancient temple in the area is the Shri Ugratara Mandir in Mahishi, Saharsa, which is dedicated to the goddess Tara and associated with the Tantrik cult, not Lord Vishnu. While there are many Vishnu temples across India, Saharsa's prominent temple is the Ugratara Mandir.





**CHANDRIKA STHAN** Saharsa Bihar" translates to Chandika Sthan, Biratpur, Saharsa, Bihar. It refers to an ancient and significant temple dedicated to Goddess Chandi (also known as Maa Chandika Bhawani), located in the Biratpur village within the Saharsa district of Bihar, India

**The Surya Mandir** in Saharsa, Bihar, refers to the Sun Temple at Kandaha, a significant religious and historical site located about 16 km west of the Saharsa district headquarters. This temple is recognized by the Archaeological Survey of India for its magnificent idol of Surya (Sun God) riding a seven-horse chariot, carved from a single granite slab.
